Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Sets Ambitious Vision for India's Future in 78th Independence Day Address

In his 78th Independence Day speech, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi outlined a series of futuristic goals aimed at shaping India's growth, driving innovation, and positioning the country as a global leader across various sectors. Watch the address at the following [link](#).



Key points from the Prime Minister's address include:

1. **Ease of Living Mission:** PM Modi outlined his vision to fulfil 'Ease of Living' on a mission mode. He spoke of enhancing the quality of life in urban areas through systematic assessments and improvements in infrastructure and services.
2. **Revival of Nalanda Spirit:** The Prime Minister sought to revive the ancient Nalanda University spirit, positioning India as a global education hub by promoting higher learning and research. This builds on the inauguration of Nalanda University in 2024.
3. **Made in India Chip-Semiconductor Production:** PM Modi outlined India's commitment to becoming a global leader in semiconductor production, aiming to reduce dependency on imports and enhance technological self-sufficiency.
4. **Skill India:** Referring to the Budget 2024, the Prime Minister highlighted landmark initiatives announced by the government to train India's youth and become the skill capital of the world.
5. **Hub of Industrial Manufacturing:** PM Modi envisioned transforming India into a global manufacturing hub, leveraging its vast resources and skilled workforce.
6. **"Design in India, Design for the World":** The Prime Minister exalted indigenous design capabilities and urged to create products that cater to both domestic and international markets, coining this phrase.
7. **Leader in Global Gaming Market:** PM Modi said that India must leverage its rich ancient legacy and literature to come up with Made in India gaming products. He added that Indian professionals must lead the global gaming market, not just in playing but also in producing games, stating that Indian games should make their mark worldwide.
8. **Green Jobs and Green Hydrogen Mission:** PM Modi emphasized the importance of green jobs in India's efforts to combat climate change. He stated that the focus of the country is now on green growth and green jobs, which will generate employment opportunities while contributing to environmental protection. The Prime Minister reiterated India's commitment to becoming a global leader in green hydrogen production and creating sustainable employment opportunities in environmental conservation and renewable energy sectors.
9. **Swasth Bharat Mission:** PM said that to achieve the goal of Viksit Bharat 2047, India must tread the path 'Swasth Bharat' which has begun with the launch of Rashtriya Poshan Abhiyan.
10. **State-level Investment Competition:** The Prime Minister called for state governments to establish clear policies to attract investments, offer assurances of good governance, and ensure confidence in the law and order situation.
11. **Indian Standards as Global Benchmarks:** PM Modi spoke on India's aspiration to be recognized for its commitment to quality, stating that Indian standards should aspire to become international benchmarks.
12. **Climate Change Targets:** The Prime Minister reiterated the India's ambitious goal of achieving 500 gigawatts of renewable energy capacity by 2030. He noted that India has been the only country among the G20 nations to meet its Paris Accord goals.
13. **Medical Education Expansion:** PM Modi announced plans to add 75,000 new medical seats in the next 5 years, aiming to enhance the country's medical education capacity and address the growing demand for healthcare professionals.
14. **Inducting Fresh Blood in Politics:** PM Modi gave a call to bring 1 lakh youth into the political system, specifically those with no history of politics in their families. The Prime Minister said this initiative was aimed at fighting the evils of nepotism and casteism and inducting fresh blood into India's polity.

At the invitation of H.E. Mr. Donald Tusk, Prime Minister of the Republic of Poland, Shri Narendra Modi, Prime Minister of the Republic of India, paid an official visit to Poland from August 21-22, 2024. The historic visit, came as both nations celebrate the 70th anniversary of their diplomatic relations. Recognizing their long-standing ties, reaffirming the deep-rooted bonds of friendship between their countries and peoples, and commitment to realizing the full potential of their ties, the two leaders decided to elevate India-Poland bilateral relations to the level of a "Strategic Partnership". First-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Ukraine, since diplomatic relations were established between the two countries in the year 1992



Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi undertook a visit to Ukraine on 23 August 2024, at the invitation of the President of Ukraine, H.E. Volodymyr Zelenskyy. This was the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Ukraine, since diplomatic relations were established between the two countries in the year 1992.

Political Relations

Both leaders expressed mutual interest in elevating bilateral relations from a comprehensive partnership to a strategic partnership in the future. They reaffirmed their commitment to further developing bilateral ties for the benefit of the peoples of both countries based on mutual trust, respect, and openness. The Leaders reviewed the steady and positive trajectory of bilateral ties that have strengthened significantly over the last three decades, and appreciated the role played by regular engagements between India and Ukraine at various levels, including their meetings in Apulia in June 2024 and in Hiroshima in May 2023 on the margins of the G7 Summits, the visit of the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Ukraine to New Delhi in March 2024, multiple interactions and telephone conversations between the External Affairs Minister of India and the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Ukraine; between the National Security Advisor of India and the Head of the Office of the President of Ukraine, and the 9th round of Foreign Office Consultations held in Kyiv in July 2023, in enhancing mutual understanding, trust, and cooperation. The Leaders appreciated the participation of Ukrainian official delegations in the Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit 2024, and the Raisina Dialogue 2024. [Source](#).

Indian Economy on the Transformational Paths

Indian Government to launch trade connect e-platform for exporters and MSMEs

The government recently announced the development of a trade connect e-platform to enhance connectivity between exporters, MSMEs, and entrepreneurs with Indian missions abroad, export promotion councils, and other partner government agencies. This platform aims to offer comprehensive information on global trade events, benefits from India's free trade agreements (FTAs), and other pertinent international trade-related data. Significant districts showing healthy export growth include Jamnagar, Kanchipuram, Mumbai, Pune, Surat, and Kachchh. During April-May of this fiscal year, Jamnagar topped the list with exports valued at US\$10 billion, followed by Kanchipuram with US\$3.27 billion, Mumbai with US\$2.24 billion, Pune with US\$2.14 billion, Kachchh with US\$2 billion, and Surat with US\$1.98 billion.



IMF revised India's growth forecast to 7% for FY25

According to Dr Gita Gopinath, the IMF's first deputy managing director, India's economic growth has been stronger than anticipated. This positive outlook is attributed to a recovery in private consumption and favourable monsoon conditions, which resulted in the International Monetary Fund (IMF) revising its growth forecast for 2024-25 to 7%. Gopinath noted that India's growth has outperformed expectations from the last fiscal year, and these carryover effects are influencing the IMF's optimistic forecast for the current year. She highlighted that the revival of private consumption, particularly in rural areas, significantly contributes to the country's economic growth.



Indian startups maintain momentum with over \$1 billion in funding for July

Indian startups continued their impressive performance, achieving total funding of over US\$ 1.03 billion across 126 deals in July. This includes 28 growth-stage deals totalling US\$ 725 million and 72 early-stage deals worth US\$ 311.83 million. Although this represents a significant decrease from June's exceptional funding of US\$ 1.93 billion, it is the highest amount recorded for July in the past three years. The spike in June was driven by a notable US\$ 665 million round led by Zepto, followed by substantial investments in Flipkart, PharmEasy, and Lenskart. Geographically, Bengaluru led with 42 funding deals, contributing around 37% of the overall funding in July. Delhi-NCR and Mumbai followed with 33 and 24 deals, respectively.



ONDC hits new milestone with 12 million orders in July

The Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC), supported by the government, has achieved a significant milestone by processing 12 million orders in July. This achievement reflects a daily peak of about 430,000 orders. Of the total orders, approximately 4.4 million were from the mobility sector, while the remaining 7.6 million were from the non-mobility domain. In the non-mobility category, food and beverages led with 1.7 million transactions, followed by groceries with 1.4 million and fashion with 0.6 million transactions. The remaining 4 million orders were spread across on-network logistics, beauty and personal care, home and kitchen, and retail vouchers. Currently, ONDC includes about 630,000 sellers and service providers operating in 600 cities, with delivery capabilities extending to 1,200 cities across the country.

Tata Curvv EV is a new electric SUV coming from India and it is very affordable

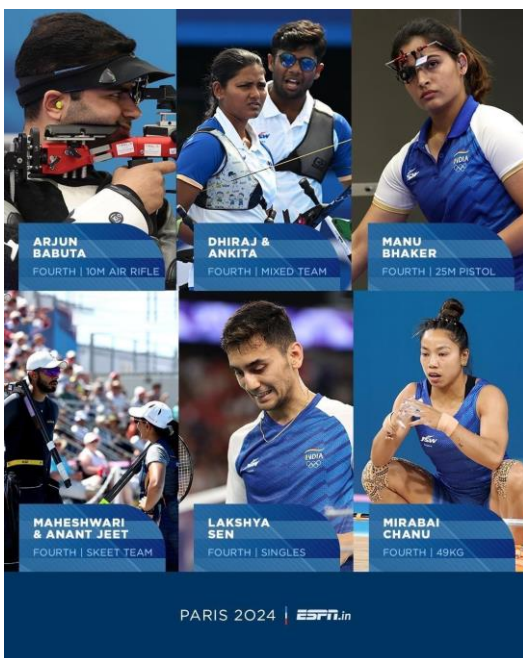


For those who don't know, Tata Motors is a company headquartered in the Indian city of Mumbai (formerly Bombay), part of the Tata Group, which owns British Jaguar Land Rover, South Korean Tata Daewoo, and joint ventures with Hitachi and Stellantis. By the way, it is the largest Indian car manufacturer. Judging by the characteristics and price, the company clearly wants this model to succeed, and here's why. The Tata Curvv EV rests on the 2nd generation electric platform, which is exactly what they call it (Generation 2 EV). The offer will include two battery sizes of 45kWh and 55kWh. According to tests by the Automotive Research Association of India, the range of the batteries is 502 km or 585 km, which sounds very optimistic to us, although it seems quite well aerodynamically resolved. If you ask us, at least 20 percent of the range should be removed. The charging speed is relatively modest, it is 70kW DC, but they say that you can get 150km in 15 minutes of charging. From a design point of view, the Tata Curvv EV has a distinctive look, we would say that it is a coupe model with a sloping roof line, which somewhat sets it apart from the classic SUV look. The front fascia has an LED DRL line across the entire width, while the standard lights are placed lower. Some will say that it resembles the Tata Nexon model, which is actually true. Let's also mention the 18-inch alloy wheels, the Curvv EV stands out with unique elements such as 18-inch alloy wheels and flush door handles. Likewise, the luggage compartment is spacious with its 500 liters, there is an infotainment system and a driver's screen at the front, and it supports ADAS Level 2 autonomous driving. 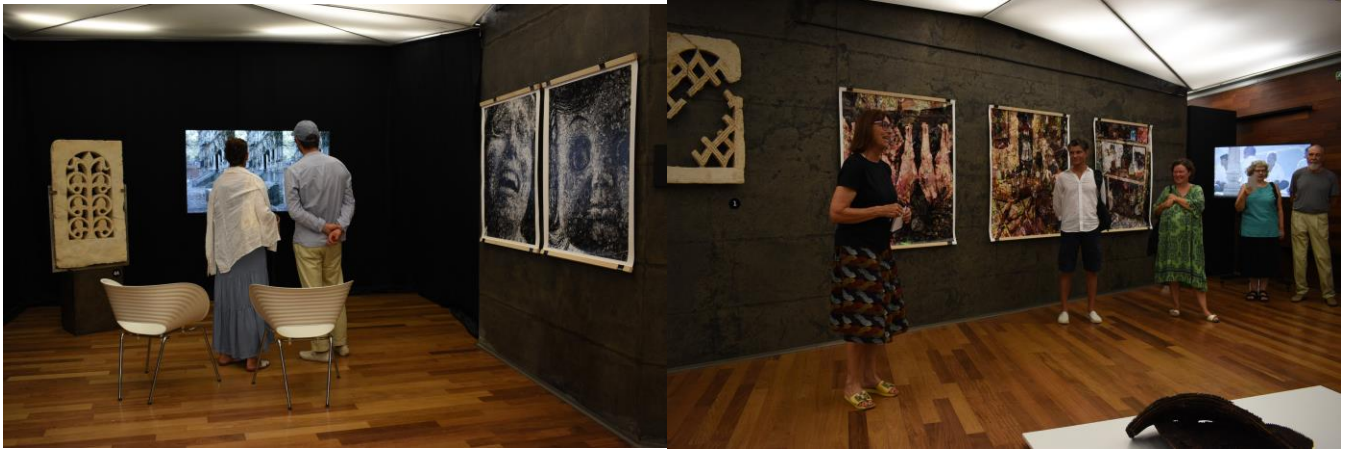
Background

The partition of India in its most basic form is a story of unprecedented human displacement and forced migration. It is a story in which millions sought new homes in environments that were alien and resistive. More than being a story of a violent divide based on faith and religion, it is also a story of how a way of life and ages of co-existence came to a sudden and dramatic end.

About 6 million non-Muslims moved out from what had become West Pakistan and another 6.5 million Muslims moved out from the Indian part of Punjab, Delhi, etc., into West Pakistan. In the east, an estimated 2 million non-Muslims moved out of East Bengal (Pakistan) and later in 1950, another 2 million non-Muslims moved into West (India) Bengal. It is estimated that about one million Muslims had moved out of West Bengal.

The estimate of those killed has varied from 500,000 to over 1,000,000. The generally accepted figure stands at around 500,000.

India in Croatia in July: Indian Summer in Istria



As part of the "Summer of India in Istria" project, the Museum-Museo Lapidarium opened the group exhibition Contemporary Indian Art on Saturday, August 10, 2024. The works of Samit Das, Sakshi Gupta, Zakkir Hussain, Mithu Sen, Sudarshan Shetty and Avinash Veeraraghavan are on display, offering us an insight into India's extremely rich and diverse contemporary art practice. Various media created ten years ago are included, from sculpture, photography, drawing to installations and video. Most of the works come from the Krinzinger Gallery in Vienna, one of the few European galleries that has been representing and promoting artists from India for many years. The special feature of the exhibition are the new works that were specially made for the Novigrad museum. It is an ambient installation by Mithu Sen, which consists of 14 "transparent" letters made and connected by LED strips. The artist found inspiration for the light installation in the poetry of AG Matoš. On the other hand, the artist Samit Das finds inspiration in the museum itself, in the Lapidarium collection. During his residential stay in Novigrad, from July 1 to 14, Das created artists' books and drawings, which he placed about museum monuments. Given that Das's works were made exclusively on handmade paper from India, the last part of the exhibition is dedicated to the community, that is, to all the participants of the handmade paper workshop in Novigrad, which is also a thank you to everyone who followed us through an extensive and diverse project. Summer of India in Istria". The exhibition was realized with the support of the Ministry of Culture and Media of the Republic of Croatia, the County of Istria - Administrative Department for Culture and Heritage, the City of Novigrad-Cittanova, the Tourist Board of Novigrad-Cittanova and the Embassy of India in Zagreb.

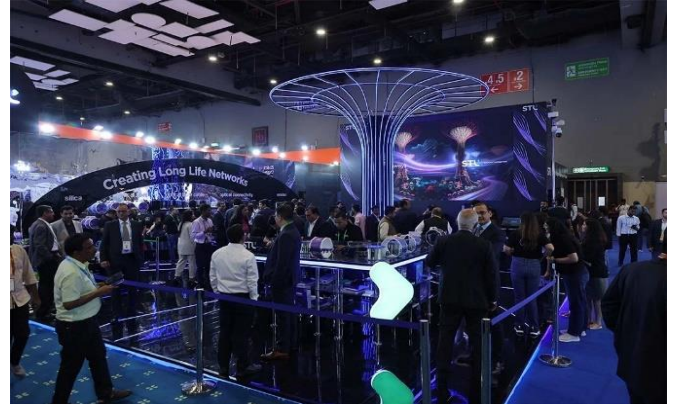
